ENGAGEMENT, DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION UPDATES

More Rebuild improvement projects are moving forward, despite the growing chill in the air. This month design began on the planning and redesign of two new athletics fields, at Chew Playground and Capitolo Playground. Over the winter months, Rebuild is preparing for a busy spring with construction starting at at least 6 sites as soon as the weather warms up.

Rebuild named IMPACT Services as the non-profit project lead for the major renovation project at the McPherson Square Library. Community engagement for this multi-million dollar transformation project will begin in early 2020.

The winter is a good opportunity to focus on indoor projects, like new roofs, security systems, and fire alarms. Across the City, Parks & Recreation and Free Library skilled trades staff continue to carry out this vital work at selected sites.





FINANCE UPDATES

FUNDING SOURCES

The table below shows actual and projected funding for Rebuild through FY2021, including the November 2018 bond issuance made possible by the Philadelphia Beverage Tax. Bond funds and funding from the City's capital budget support design and construction at Rebuild sites. Grant funding, including the William Penn Foundation's historic commitment of up to \$100 million, support design and construction as well as costs that are not capital eligible, including Rebuild's diversity and inclusion programs, community engagement, and operating costs.



CONTRACT PARTICIPATION

Rebuild has ambitious goals for contracting with minority and women-owned firms. As shown in the tables below, commitments on contracts initiated by the Rebuild office (as opposed to inherited contracts), currently exceed Rebuild goals. Rebuild expects spending will align with contract commitments as projects advance.





WORKFORCE PARTICIPATION

Workforce participation is subject to month-to-month fluctuations. Currently Rebuild is within 1% of achieving its 45% goal for hours completed by people of color. Rebuild continues to meet its ethnicity-specific goal for work hours completed by Hispanic journeypersons.

As construction gets underway at more sites, participation continues to increase on other workforce goals not yet met. Such goals include work hours completed by African-American and Asian journeypersons, and trade-specific goals for people of color and women working as laborers and skilled tradespeople.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

Rebuild's workforce development programs began in September 2019 with a pilot cohort comprising 16 participants. The program provides both entry-level and experienced tradespeople with new pathways to membership in Philadelphia's skilled trade unions.

The program started with a 3-week professional development immersion that included OSHA-10 training and topics like career management, communication, and conflict resolution. Of the initial cohort, 8 participants have already been registered as apprentices through the unions (one is a cement masonry apprentice through Local 592, one is a commercial painting apprentice through DC 21, and six are roofing apprentices through Local 30).

The remaining participants are continuing their training in a pre-apprenticeship (managed in partnership with DC 21 and PHA) designed to prepare them to successfully apply to the 2020 apprenticeship class through DC 21/Finishing Trades Institute (FTI). Three painting trainees passed the FTI's December 6 apprenticeship test. Successful candidates will become union apprentices following in person interviews completed in January 2020.





BUSINESS SUPPORTS

The second cohort of Rebuild Ready businesses completed the free consultancy program on December 15 2019. Recruitment ended for the third cohort of businesses to take part in this 8-week course in January 2020.

From blueprint reading to help with bonding and insurance, Rebuild Ready offers tailored skills building and assistance to small businesses to work on Rebuild projects.

18 diverse local businesses have been approved for the Emerging Vendors program, which allows minority- and women-owned firms to count toward Rebuild's participation goals while applying for their City certification.

LOOKING BACK: REBUILD PROGRAM MILESTONES

- Spring 2017 passage of Bill 170206, which authorized the issuance of bonds for Rebuild and established the delivery and approval structure for the expenditure of bond proceeds.
- November 2017 21 nonprofits were qualified to manage Rebuild projects and therefore eligible to participate in Rebuild's competitive grant application process.
- November 2017 Rebuild Office proposes initial 64 sites to City Council in the form
 of Project Statement and lease ordinance, two-thirds of which are in neighborhoods
 with high rates of poverty, drug crimes, or health risks aligning with Rebuild's stated
 goal of investing equitably across Philadelphia. Other selected sites meet other
 Rebuild priorities such as being in very poor physical condition or being in "middle
 neighborhoods" where investments can help stimulate additional community
 development.
- May 2018 Philadelphia Building Trades Council signs historic MOU with PRA and the City that creates a pathway to union membership for women and minority workers interested in skilled trades careers.
- June 2018 City Council passes amended Rebuild Project Statement and Lease Ordinance.
- July 2018 Pennsylvania Supreme Court rules to uphold Philadelphia Beverage Tax, providing Administration with confidence to proceed with issuing bonds for Rebuild.
- September 2018 In anticipation of having bond proceeds, Rebuild opens grant applications to Project Users for first five Rebuild sites. Launching grant applications included:
 - Providing Project Users with resources and training on Rebuild standards and processes.
 - Developing grant applications and legal documents.
 - Holding a diversity networking event to connect diverse contractors with Project Users.
 - Opening a contract opportunity portal that provides a central location for contractors to find opportunities to join Project User teams.



LOOKING BACK: REBUILD PROGRAM MILESTONES

- November 2018 Rebuild Office opens grant applications for an additional seven projects to be managed by Project Users. PAID bond issuance results in \$86.5 million for Rebuild; this 20-year bond issuance was made possible by the Philadelphia Beverage Tax.
- December 2018 Rebuild Office celebrates first ground breaking at Parkside Fields, a project being managed by the Philadelphia Redevelopment Authority.
- February 2019 Rebuild Office announces next six projects to undergo construction in spring 2019, with more announcements coming.
- March 2019 Rebuild Office announces first two awards to Project Users and more projects that will start in the spring; community engagement begins at C.B. Moore Recreation Center.
- May 2019 Rebuild Office announces next round of Project User grant applications for five sites.
- July 2019 Rebuild launches recruitment for first cohort of workforce development trainees. Diverse candidates interested in careers in painting, roofing, and cement masonry were invited to apply.
- July 2019 Rebuild celebrates its first ribbon-cutting at the Fishtown Rec Center, where a \$1.1 million playground project was completed in partnership with the Council President, DCNR. Parks& Rec. and the Trust for Public Land.
- July 2019 The Rebuild Ready small business support program inducted its first cohort of 19 Philadelphia M/WBEs. These design, engagement, and construction businesses are receiving one-on-one coaching and attending targeted trainings to support getting work on Rebuild projects.
- August 2019 Rebuild Office announces fourth round of Project User grant applications for three sites.
- August 2019 Rebuild Office opens a second non-profit RFQ process, allowing additional Philadelphia non-profits to become eligible to apply for Rebuild grants.
- September 2019 First workforce development cohort of 16 participants begins training through Rebuild's PHL Pipeline and PRA Talent Development programs.
- December 2019 Second cohort of Rebuild Ready businesses graduate the free training program, ready to bid for and win work on Rebuild projects.
